### Writing

We will be reading the following texts:

We will be using these texts as a stimulus for writing character profiles, non-chronological reports about traditional tale villains and retelling stories from another character's point of view.

We will continue to learn about using adjectives, verbs and adverbs to make our writing more interesting and how to extend our sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions.

We will also be learning how to use fronted adverbials to begin our sentences in different ways and will be introduced to direct speech.

### Maths

### Year 2

Children will be learning the following:

Money:

- Counting in pounds and pence
- Making amounts in different ways
  - Comparing amounts of money
    - Finding change

### Multiplication and Division:

- Recognising, making and adding equal groups
  - Using arrays
  - Multiplying and dividing by grouping and sharing
  - Multiplying and dividing by 2,5 and 10
    - Doubling and halving

### Length and Height:

- Measuring in centimetres and metres
  - Comparing lengths and heights
  - · Ordering lengths and heights

### Year 3

Children will be learning the following:

### Multiplication and Division:

- Multiplying 2-digit and 1-digit numbers with and without an exchange
- Dividing 2-digit by 1-digit numbers with and without remainders

### Length and Perimeter:

- Measuring in centimetres, metres and millimetres
- Comparing, adding and subtracting lengths
  - Measuring perimeter

### Fractions:

- Comparing and ordering unit and non-unit fractions
- Counting in fractions on a number line
- Looking at equivalent fraction on a number line and on bar models.

In addition to this, children will be given spellings every week. These will be linked to spelling rules taught in our spelling lessons. We will be practising these in school but any extra practise at home would help. In regard to reading, children are encouraged to read as much as possible at home.
